ASSOCIATION OVERVIEW

VISION

HAQ's mission is to enhance the social and cultural welfare of the Hazara community, fostering unity, tolerance, and acceptance, while facilitating integration into Australian society. The organization emphasizes preserving cultural and national values and appreciating Australia's diverse cultural heritage and human rights.

MISSION

Its mission is to create a supportive environment where individuals and families can thrive while preserving and celebrating Hazara heritage, traditions, and values. HAQ aims to provide resources, advocacy, and programs that address the unique challenges faced by the Hazara community, including education, employment, and social integration. Through its efforts, HAQ aspires to build bridges between cultures, promote inclusivity, and contribute to the broader Australian society as a vibrant and resilient community.

FINANCIAL HIGHLIGHTS

HAQ's financial position appears stable, with substantial resources directed toward the Cultural Centre project. Continued fundraising efforts and careful management of expenses will be critical to achieving long-term goals.

- The organization has made significant investments in the Cultural Centre project, which dominates both income and expenses. While progress has been made toward its fundraising goal, there is still a long way to go to achieve the target.
- HAQ is maintaining a healthy bank balance, which can be utilized for upcoming programs and expenses.
- Diversified income streams, including membership fees, event support, and program funding, demonstrate a stable financial strategy.

Income

HAQ has generated significant income through various sources. These include:

- Cultural Centre \$1000/ member, with a contribution of \$144,000 (14% of the target).
- Cultural Centre fundraising efforts, with a contribution of \$82,680 (51% of the target).
- Membership fees and other contributions amounting to \$82,758 (65% of the target).
- Additional support from local programs and general donations, collectively contributing smaller but meaningful amounts.

Expenses

- A substantial portion of the funds (\$657,337.14, or 91.4%) has been allocated to the Cultural Centre project.
- Other significant expenses include bills (\$40,420.17), events (\$15,450.03), and funeral-related costs (\$6,000).
- Administrative costs are relatively minimal at 5.6% of total expenses.

HAQ actively works to keep this heritage alive by organizing cultural events, workshops, and celebrations that showcase Hazara's art, cuisine, music, and traditional practices. These events serve as a platform for the community to connect, educate younger generations about their roots, and share their culture with the wider Australian public.









Below is an overview of the key events planned for 2024:

- Baba Mazari 29th Anniversary of Martyrdom (17th March 2024): A tribute to the Hazara leader's legacy and sacrifices.
- Eid Fitr/Nowruz Mela (14th April 2024): A joyful celebration of Eid and Nowruz with cultural festivities.
- Eid Adha Mela (16th June 2024): A community gathering to mark Eid Adha with traditional observances.
- Muharram Commemorations (8th–17th July 2024): A time for spiritual reflection and remembrance of Imam Hussain.
- Hazara Genocide Memorial Day (29th September 2024): A solemn day of remembrance and advocacy.
- Girls Volleyball Tournament (8th & 15th December 2024): A sporting event for young women to build camaraderie and confidence.
- Triple-P Positive Parenting Program (8th & 15th December 2024): Workshops to support mothers in enhancing their parenting skills.

CULTURAL CENTRE PROJECT

The Hazara Cultural Centre project is a cornerstone initiative of the Hazara Association of Queensland (HAQ), aimed at creating a dedicated space to-

preserve, promote, and celebrate the rich cultural heritage of the Hazara community. This ambitious project seeks to provide a multi-purpose facility that serves as a hub for cultural events, educational programs, community gatherings, and social support services. The Cultural Centre will not only be a place to honor and maintain Hazara traditions but will also act as a bridge between the Hazara community and the broader multicultural society in Queensland, fostering greater understanding and inclusion.



CONSTRUCTION PROCESS & DEVELOPMENT

The construction of the HAQ Cultural Community Centre is a structured project aimed at delivering a space that fulfills the community's cultural, social, and educational needs.

The process began with extensive planning and design, involving consultations with town planners and architects to create a blueprint that complies with regulations while incorporating cultural elements. Site preparation, including land clearing, utility installation, and foundational work, has been successfully completed.

Currently, the project is in the contractor selection and approval stage. Multiple builders, including Vati Projects, Phlat Construction and Tomkin Construction, were considered, with estimates ranging from \$4.9 million to \$10 million. Building approvals (BA) have been submitted, and the design is being aligned with the available budget to ensure a cost-effective and high-quality result.

The next phases will include structural construction, interior work, and landscaping, with a focus on sustainability and functionality. Upon completion, the Centre will become a hub for community gatherings, workshops, and cultural celebrations


